The Great Westford Lunch Crunch

In celebration of National Food Day

The Westford Agricultural Commission in partnering with Westford's K-5 schools this fall to introduce students to local agriculture.

In celebration of National Food Day, Friday, Oct 24, students in Westford's K-5 schools will be invited to see how much noise they can collectively make in support of fresh food. During regular lunch periods, students will be provided a whole,

locally-sourced fresh apple, carrot or other crunchy vegetable of their caregiver's choosing and invited to simultaneously "crunch" with their classmates to see how loud a noise they can make all together.

A weeklong lunchtime countdown to the event will cover facts about local apple production and its place in Westford's history; a food drive will be held to benefit the Westford Food Pantry; and apple cores will be composted at Fat Moon Farm in Westford. To follow on the lesson, students will be invited to make a healthy eating pledge of their own on Monday, Oct 27. Food Day is a national day of awareness building for healthy, affordable, and sustainable food.
